He was formerly the Indonesian Ambassador to the United States from 2021 until 2023, the former Deputy Minister of State-Owned Enterprises in 2023, and the former Chairperson of the Indonesian Chamber of Commerce and Industry from 2015 until 7 July 2021.

He also chairs Daya Anagata Nusantara Investment Management Agency, commonly known as Danantara Indonesia or simply Danantara. The agency is the fusion of certain functions between the Indonesia Investment Authority and the country's Ministry of State-Owned Enterprises.

Inspector General of Police Dr. Krishna Murti is a high-ranking officer of the Indonesian National Police who graduated from the Indonesian Police Academy in 1991. He once served on a UNTAES mission in Eastern Slavonia and a UN mission in Sudan (UNAMID). He is the only Indonesian National Police Officer who has served strategically in the United Nations Department of Peacekeeping Operations (UN DPKO) based at the UN Headquarters in New York. His international experience and skills are the reason he currently holds the position of Head of the International Relations Division of the Indonesian National Police. His office organizes the National Central Bureau (NCB)-Interpol activities to combat international/transnational crime; carries out international missions for humanitarian peacekeeping and the development of human resource capabilities; and assists in the legal protection of Indonesian citizens abroad.

US Cyber Security Specialist.

Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) is a branch of the US Department of Homeland Security, responsible for identifying, assessing, and protecting critical infrastructure sectors from cyber threats and physical vulnerabilities. Critical Infrastructure are those assets, systems, and networks that provide functions necessary for our way of life. There are 16 critical infrastructure sectors that are part of a complex, interconnected ecosystem and any threat to these sectors could have potentially debilitating national security, economic, and public health or safety consequences.



About Indonesian National Police (POLRI)



The Indonesian National Police (Kepolisian Negara Republik Indonesia or Polri)

serves as the primary law enforcement agency in Indonesia. Established on July 1, 1946, Polri was initially part of the Indonesian National Armed Forces but became an independent institution in 1999. This separation marked a significant step in Indonesia's efforts to strengthen democratic governance and uphold human rights.



Organizational Structure and Leadership

Polri operates under a centralized structure, with its headquarters located in Kebayoran Baru, South Jakarta. The organization is led by the Chief of Police (Kapolri), a four-star general appointed by the President of Indonesia. As of January 27, 2021, the position is held by General Listyo Sigit Prabowo. Polri's hierarchy extends from the national level down to regional (Polda), district (Polres), and sub-district (Polsek) levels, ensuring comprehensive law enforcement coverage across the country.



Core Functions and Specialized Units

Polri's primary responsibilities include maintaining public order, enforcing laws, and providing protection and services to the community. To effectively carry out these duties, Polri comprises several specialized units:

- Brimob (Mobile Brigade Corps): A paramilitary unit specializing in counter-terrorism, riot control, and high-risk law enforcement operations.
- Densus 88 (Detachment 88): An elite counter-terrorism squad tasked with preventing and responding to terrorist activities.
- Korlantas (Traffic Corps): Responsible for traffic management and enforcement, including the implementation of electronic traffic law enforcement systems.
- Polairud (Marine and Air Police): Handles law enforcement in Indonesia's vast maritime and aerial domains.



About Indonesian National Police (POLRI)



Modernization and Reform Initiatives

In recent years, Polri has undertaken significant reforms to enhance professionalism, accountability, and public trust. These initiatives include:

- **Restorative Justice Approaches:** Shifting from punitive measures to community-based conflict resolution strategies to foster reconciliation and reduce recidivism.
- **Community Policing Programs:** Engaging local communities in crime prevention efforts to build mutual trust and cooperation.
- **Technological Advancements:** Implementing digital systems for traffic enforcement and case management to increase efficiency and transparency.
- **Intelligence-led policing:** A collaborative enterprise based on improved intelligence operations and community-oriented policing and problem solving. Intelligence is critical for decisionmaking, planning, strategic targeting, and crime prevention. Law enforcement agencies depend on intelligence operations on all levels; they cannot function effectively without collecting, processing, and using intelligence.

As Indonesia continues to evolve, Polri's role in safeguarding national security and upholding the rule of law remains pivotal. Ongoing reforms and modernization efforts aim to align the institution with democratic principles and the expectations of the communities it serves.
